### Curriculum

History is taught through a topic approach alongside Design & Technology, History and Art. Our Curriculum is carefully planned over a two year cycle to engage and excite all our learners.

The children undertake a programme that takes account of abilities, aptitudes and physical, emotional and intellectual development. Through History the children learn a range of skills, concepts, attitudes and methods of working.

History is taught from Reception to Year 7 and follows the UK National Curriculum. History is also taught through the UAE Social Studies curriculum which enables students to learn about ancient cultures and societies outside of the UK National Curriculum. We have a wide range of resources, such interactive boards to access the internet as a class and there is a range of Historical material in the school library. People with an interest, or expertise, in a particular topic or area of history could be invited into school to work with the children. These might be parents, grandparents, other family members, neighbours or representatives of the local community.
