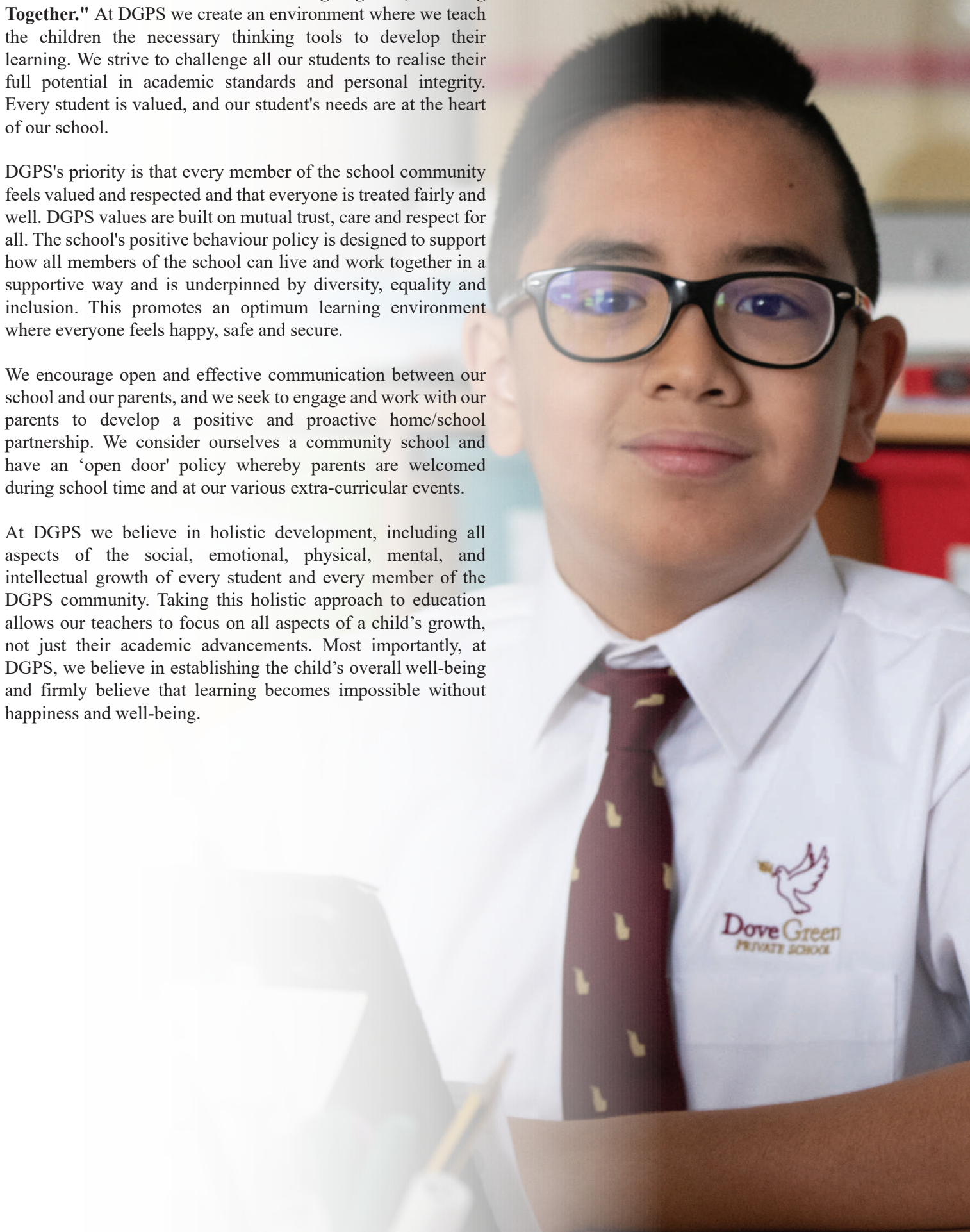
Dove Green Private School

Curriculum Overview

At Dove Green Private School, we offer an enhanced English National Curriculum (ENC) that includes Arabic and Islamic Studies as core elements of an inclusive, broad and balanced subject range. The DGPS curriculum clearly defines knowledge and skill expectations underpinned by our rigorous but highly supportive academic standards. Recognised as academically rigorous worldwide, NCE is based on mastery of core skills and concepts at each year level. At DGPS, we ensure that all students build solid foundations for lifelong learning and college and career readiness thus, the focus is on ensuring core understanding and key skills are developed at each level across all subjects. Pupils working at a mastery level are extended to apply their understandings and skills in new and challenging contexts through purposeful, cross-curricular and co-curricular learning.

Our learning experiences equip students with the knowledge, skills and understanding needed to become life-long learners and problem-solvers of tomorrow. From Foundation Stage to Year 11, our curriculum promotes innovative and inclusive opportunities that encourage a spirit of intellectual curiosity and the pursuit of knowledge. At DGPS, we promote extremely high standards and expectations for our students' personal, social and academic development and embody our community vision of '**Learning Together, Growing Together**'. Our exceptional DGPS curriculum is delivered in a happy, supportive and nurturing environment with personal growth, individualised learning and school-wide well-being underpinning a culture of appropriate curricular challenge and holistic support. A Community Campus

Dove Green Private School is the first British school in the Green Community, Dubai Investments Park One.

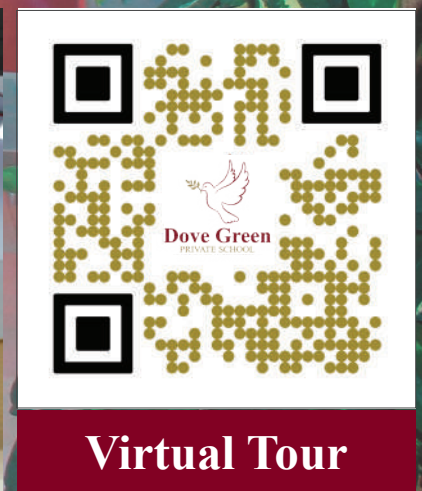
The school comprises 66 classrooms, catering for children from 3-18 years old. These include designated specialist subject rooms for all year groups in sciences, the arts, Arabic, Islamic and IT. Specialist areas in the new secondary campus include the Chemistry lab, Biology lab, Physics lab, Design Technology lab, Food Technology, Computer suite, Auditorium, 3 specialist Music rooms, Creative art room, and Dance / Drama suite.

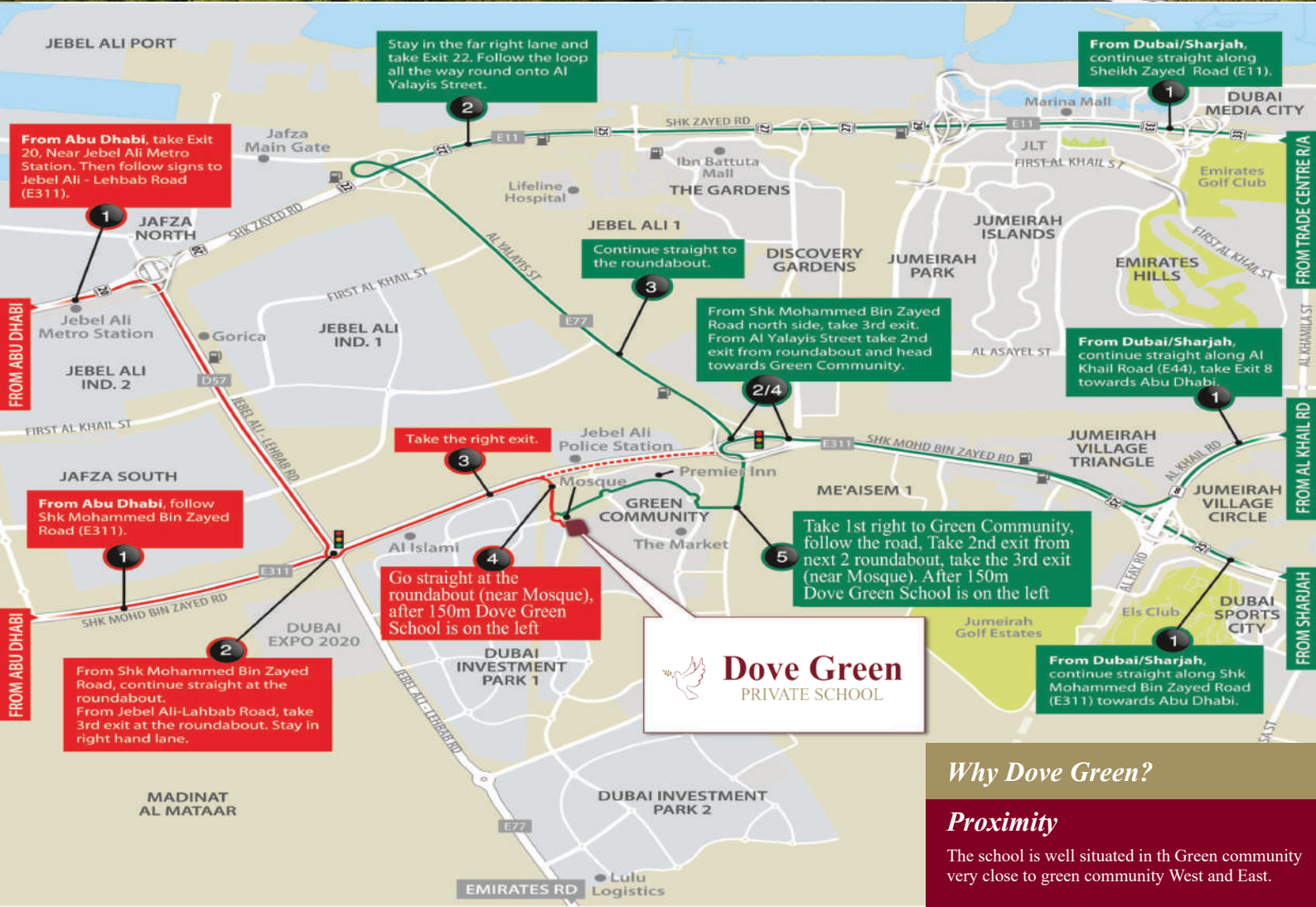
These are complemented by first-class sports facilities, including two sports halls, two large, covered swimming pools (one 20M and one 25M) an infant's pool, a Strength and Conditioning suite and a full-size astroturf as well as a multi-use court area at the back of the secondary school.

All classrooms are equipped with the latest technology to support all students and teachers in achieving high-quality outcomes. Primary classrooms all have adjoining toilet facilities, access to an outside learning area, and direct access to a multipurpose central hall where we dine together as a school and have weekly assemblies.

Two well-stocked libraries cater for all the children in the school. Outside areas are all covered with artificial grass and sunshades, making them ideal for safe, appropriate, and enjoyable play of games and sports.

We are situated next to the Green Community West residential area and have direct access to the community so families can walk or cycle to school. Our campus has a light, airy feel, which can only be experienced with a tour to soak up the atmosphere first-hand.

By limiting mobile phone use, we prioritise the well-being of our students by creating an environment that fosters genuine social connections and enhances interpersonal communication. Without the distractions of constant notifications and digital interactions, students can engage more fully in their studies and build meaningful relationships with peers and teachers. This reduction in screen time also helps alleviate the anxiety and stress that can arise from being perpetually connected to social media and online platforms. Additionally, encouraging face-to-face interaction nurtures emotional intelligence and empathy, which are crucial for personal development. Mobile phones are not in any way considered a suitable or appropriate device for learning. Our policy supports a healthier, more balanced school experience for every student.





A Thinking School

As a thinking School DGPS, is unique with our focus on giving students the tools to become life-long learner and to develop the best possible habits for success in life. DGPS is an educational community that involves both students and staff learning how to think reflectively, critically and creatively. We inspire students to be independent thinkers, and we proudly promote the 4Cs as part of our school ethos and culture:

- Creativity
- Communication
- Collaboration
- Critical Thinking.

From Foundation Stage to Year 11, the 4Cs are a key focus within our school curriculum and are woven into all lessons. Students are taught how these key skills can be applied to class learning, encouraging them to learn efficiently and become focused, reflective learners.

Additionally, our teachers model fundamental thinking processes to students, such as Thinking Maps, to promote critical and reflective thinking. These are applied across the curriculum as part of a coherent and articulate approach, encouraging harmony and a common language throughout the school. As a result, students develop a deep understanding of how they think and can successfully articulate their thoughts. Across all learning units, teachers talk about different thought processes with their students and lead in the philosophy of 'learn to think, think to learn.'

The DGPS community growth mindset implies that intelligence and skillsets are not fixed. For students, this means they can grow and develop at different rates and encourages them to think of their journey of learning new things and skills as a 'not there yet' instead of a fixed mindset, in which they shy away from challenges and learning opportunities. The language of learning used at DGPS is targeted to develop strong positive, personal understandings of learning that are vitally important to their learning journey through our school. When students self-reflect on their learning and development of knowledge and skills, they use words such as 'yet' to describe that they are getting better, and they are willing to recognise that just because they haven't mastered something or might be struggling with something, it doesn't mean that they cannot or will not get better with structured deliberate practice



An Inclusive School

Dove Green Private School is an inclusive environment where every student is a valued community member. Central to our vision are inclusivity and equity, which we prioritise through a comprehensive assessment of individual needs before admission. This process facilitates open communication with parents, ensuring a smooth transition into school.

Strong partnerships with parents are key to helping students reach their full potential. Our curriculum is enhanced to provide additional support, modification, and personalisation based on each student's unique needs. This includes support for students learning English and those who are gifted or talented.

In line with best practices for inclusion in international schools, we emphasise culturally responsive teaching, differentiated instruction, and ongoing professional development for our staff to address diverse needs effectively. Our inclusion team collaborates with teachers and works directly with students, individually or in small groups, to ensure their needs are met effectively. Compulsory Subjects of English, Mathematics, Science, Arabic language, Moral Education, UAE Social Studies, Islamic Education. and Physical Education.

Student selected options of up to 4 IGCSEs or BTEC from a wide variety of subject disciplines

Foundation Stage

At Dove Green Private School, the Foundation Stage takes children from ages 3-5 and is broken down into two year groups.

- FS1 (Ages 3-4)
- FS2 (Ages 4-5)

Here at Dove Green we provide a broad and balanced curriculum for our youngest children, aged 3 to 5 years, based on the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Children learn skills, acquire new knowledge and demonstrate their understanding through 7 areas of learning and development.

The 3 Prime Areas are a focus initially and these are: Personal, Social and Emotional Development; Physical Development; Communication and Language Development. These Prime areas are those most essential for a child's healthy development and future learning.

As they grow, the Prime areas will help to develop skills in 4 Specific Areas: Literacy Development; Mathematics; Understanding the World; Expressive Arts and Design. As active learners, our children acquire skills and knowledge in many different ways.

We believe that for learning to be effective, it is not 'what' children learn that matters, but rather 'how' they learn, and this 'how' is what practitioners consider when planning learning environments and experiences for children.

Children are exposed to 'empowering environments' which act as the 'third teacher'. These environments are set up to ensure children build independence and exercise their right to choose their own preferences.

Our teachers and learning support assistants are highly skilled in facilitating children's learning through observing, questioning and playing with the students. This allows the adults to gain an accurate picture of each child's current capabilities and then plan out those crucial next steps. The teachers are constantly adapting the environment in line with the interests of the children whilst exposing them to new experiences too.



Primary Curriculum

At Dove Green Private School, the Primary level of schooling takes students from age 5 to 11, and is broken into two stages:

- Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2, ages 5 to 7)
- Key Stage 2 (Years 3 to 6, ages 7 to 11)

Our primary phase at Dove Green Private School is committed to providing children with a quality education that promotes a love of life-long learning by inspiring, motivating and engaging a future generation of learners. Our bespoke curriculum is based on the National Curriculum for England to ensure that the skills and knowledge gained here align with UK expectations and is adapted by our staff to have relevance to students living here in the UAE. In addition to our core subjects mapped out by the National Curriculum, we teach Arabic, Islamic and Moral, Social and Cultural Studies, which comprise the local Ministry of Education curriculum. Dove Green is distinguished by its commitment to unlocking each child's potential. Our teachers consistently challenge students' intellectual boundaries through innovative and stimulating lessons, emphasising the cultivation of our 4Cs; creativity, collaboration, communication, and critical thinking.

In Key Stage 1, we build upon the child-centered foundations set in the Early Years by providing a dynamic and captivating environment for our young learners to flourish. Our approach fosters lasting learning experiences, achieved by integrating rich texts throughout each topic, allowing children to delve deeper into the story and feel inspired to discuss important issues and write purposefully, building up their skill set further to implement into Key Stage Two.

In Key Stage 2, The United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) underpin our entire curriculum, and all 17 SDGs are covered across Years 3 to 6. Incorporating the SDGs provides students with a meaningful and tangible purpose for their learning. They offer a framework that connects classroom education to real-world challenges, emphasising the importance of global issues like poverty, climate change, and inequality. By aligning their learning with these goals, students gain a deeper understanding of pressing global concerns and develop a sense of responsibility and agency in shaping a better future. This integration enriches their education and fosters a sense of purpose, encouraging students to see themselves as active contributors to a more sustainable and equitable world.

Instead of conventional textbooks and worksheets, which have the potential to stifle progress due to predetermined learning trajectories, our curriculum is brought to life through meticulously crafted hooks, igniting a sense of fascination from the very outset. Including our students in shaping their learning journey fosters a more personalised curriculum that resonates with each individual, giving their learning purpose and fostering an awareness of the importance and impact of life-long education.

"Learning together, growing together" defines our ethos, encapsulating our collaborative journey with each student.



Key Stage 3 (Years 7 to 9)

Key Stage 3 (KS3), incorporating years 7 to 9, marks the start of the DGPS senior school curriculum and builds upon the primary curriculum's mastery of subject knowledge and learning skills. Aligned with leading international best practices, our progressive and developmental KS3 ensures that students have the best possible chance of success in Key Stage 4 (Year 10 and 11) where students complete GCSE/iGCSE qualification examinations. Our enhanced ENC has been adapted to match local requirements and enriched to provide a depth of learning across a broad and balanced range of subjects. We also prioritise high-level Arabic Language development, UAE Social Studies and, for Muslim students, Islamic Studies as part of our commitment to the values and requirements of the UAE's Ministry of Education.

Further, our KS3 programme develops as fully as possible the understanding, knowledge and skills of each student so that they can make highly informed and personalised choices for their Year 10 pathways. This will keep them on course to meet the challenges they will face in a rapidly globalising and competitive world when they leave DGPS. It is also our aim to ensure that all of our students leave DGPS with the prerequisite qualifications to access higher education and the global workforce worldwide.

To ensure their best chance of success, help engage learners, build confidence, and make learning fun and exciting. Our blended approach through Pearson Activelearn incorporates the use of a single digital platform, across all subjects, which allows for a consistent and straightforward approach to teaching and learning with the support of a diverse range of print resources. As a Pearson Edexcel approved examination centre for Key Stage 4, this allows consistency and progression throughout our high school programme that aligns to the similarly progressive primary curriculum.

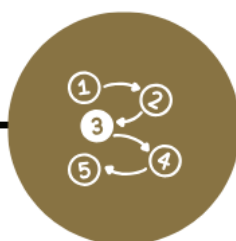
All students will study:

- **Literacy:** Language and literacy are of personal, social and economic importance. Our ability to use language lies at the centre of the development and expression of our emotions, our thinking, our learning and our sense of personal identity develop students' communication skills and increase their command of language. This is developed through English (Language and Literature) and at least one foreign language (Arabic and French).
- **Numeracy:** Being numerate helps us to function responsibly in everyday life and contribute effectively to society. It increases our opportunities within the world of work and establishes foundations that can be built upon through lifelong learning. To teach students how to calculate and appreciate relationships and patterns in number and space and to think logically and express themselves clearly. This is developed through Mathematics, Computer Science and Science based subjects.
- **Science:** Science education allows students to understand better how and why things function. Science can teach children about the world that surrounds them. This is developed through Integrated Science in KS3.
- **Technology:** To teach students the required range of technological skills, including current and future-proofed applications of ICT, to develop, plan and communicate ideas and to produce and evaluate high-quality products. This is developed through Computer Science. Our KS3 curriculum consists of: Mathematics, English, Sciences (Biology, Chemistry and Physics), Arabic, French, Humanities, Art, Music Design Technology, Computer Science, French, Physical Education, Social, Moral and Cultural Studies.

Extra and co-curricular opportunities allow our students to participate in various activities that complement their academic studies. These include life-changing trips and creative, sporting, social, and service opportunities.

The school has highly experienced, motivated Physical Education staff that teach a wide variety of sports during curriculum and in extra curricular activities.

Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11)

At Key Stage 4, students will study for their IGCSE exams. IGCSEs are the world's most popular international qualification for 14 to 16-year-olds and are taught in almost 4,000 schools worldwide.

Pathways include mandatory and optional subjects that encompass both vocational and creative pathways. Our broad and balanced KS4 curriculum is tailored to the individual student's needs and contains a range of possibilities and opportunities for their education Post-16 education. At DGPS we provide each of our students with Key Stage 4 courses that are designed and taught to prepare students for their future best while helping their families to support their studies and aspirations appropriately from home. Each student follows a tailored curriculum based on their academic strengths, interests, and aspirations for the future, with students typically studying seven or eight subjects, including compulsory Maths, English, and Science.

International GCSEs

DGPS is a Pearson Edexcel-approved examination centre, and our students will qualify with Pearson Edexcel International GCSEs. These are globally recognised qualifications with academic content and assessments designed specifically for international learners. Pearson Edexcel International GCSE (9–1) qualifications are comparable to the UK GCSE, with appropriate international content and assessment that will enable successful progression for learners. They are studied in over 80 countries worldwide and in independent schools in the UK. Available in 37 subjects, they are equivalent, grade for grade, to UK GCSEs and accepted by universities globally. Aimed at learners aged 14 to 16, they provide the skills and knowledge needed to progress to A Levels, International A Levels, onto university and into employment. International topics and the use of culturally sensitive content ensures that these qualifications are even more relevant and engaging for our students, allowing for learning in a local context to a global standard.

Pearson Edexcel International GCSEs use the 9–1 grading scale for the Ofqual regulated GCSEs in the UK. The UK government introduced a new scale to raise standards and recognise outstanding performance. It improves differentiation between learners with a nine (9–1) point grading scale rather than an eight (A*–G). This means that students are ideally placed to progress to International A-Levels (IAL) and universities worldwide.
